The Highways Dept of the Council have agreed for us to husband this strip.

Wild flowers come in waves, each in their own time. So the cowslips and meadow saxifrage are no longer visible. In their place we have an abundance of yellow rattle, ox-eye daisies, birds-foot trefoil, eyebright, buttercups and various other species. Soon the knapweed will flower.

The bank is left so that plants can set their seed ready for next year. Then everything has to be mowed and taken away. Your help in that would be very welcome.

In the meantime, feel free to inspect the developing greenery and flowers when you pass by. It is our own wildlife area, so enjoy it!

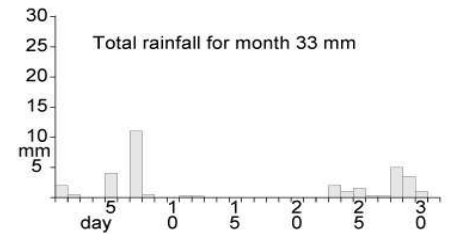
Mission Room
