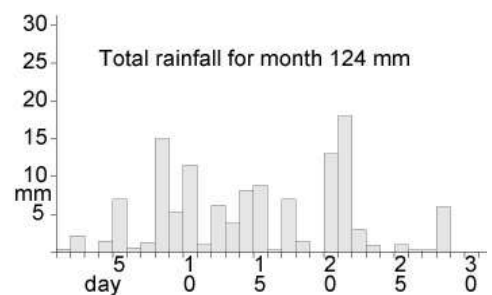
### Leyburn Moor Road Tip
