## **Deborah's Nature Watch**

Several people came across me recently when I was recording plants around Thornton Rust and I thought they might like to know a little more about it.

The Botanical Society that I send records to now use "monads" (1 x 1 km squares) as the basis for data collection. Fortunately Thornton Rust falls very neatly into the Ordnance Survey monad SD97,88.

I recorded 226 species of plants growing in the wild or as garden weeds. The rarest is a little brown sedge found in the Kennel Field known as *Blysmus compresses*, but the field itself and that of the adjacent quarry are much more spectacular.

Being August I will have missed loads of spring plants which have disappeared without trace, so another search next May will be needed. Deborah Millward


#### **Harvest Festival**

# West End Bank

Contractors employed by Aysgarth Parish Council will be visiting Thornton Rust twice during September to strim the West End Bank. This is the area to the south side of the road opposite Nipe Lane where a wide variety of wild flowers grow during the summer months. At the moment the contractors cannot give me an exact date when the work will be carried out as it is weather dependent, but they expect it to be done during the weeks commencing Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> and Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September.

After the contractors have completed their work the strimmings need to be raked off and removed from the bank. This will allow the bank to develop further and give an even better display of wildflowers next year.

# **Stop Ure Pollution (SUP)**



Following Pip Pointon's excellent editorial in the Upper Wensleydale Newsletter, Stop Ure Pollution is a new Wensleydale community group whose aim is to promote a clean, safe River Ure for all users and hopefully to obtain designated bathing water status once DEFRA re-opens applications next year.

With the help of Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust, we carried out our initial low water testing on the 21<sup>st</sup> August at 45 sites along the length of the river from Lunds down to Aldborough. We hope to be retesting at high water within the next month.

We will then carry out more frequent testing at 2 sites on multiple occasions with the support of Surfers Against Sewage. We will continue to engage with Yorkshire Water, the farming community, local politicians and media to facilitate the health and biodiversity of the river.

We have a Facebook page (<u>Stop</u> <u>Ure Pollution</u>) and Instagram page (<u>stop.ure.pollution</u>). Currently there are also updates on the Pipspatch.com website pending development of our own website.
